

SYNOPSIS

For 28 years, in a run down pool below a mountain by the ocean, Snorri Magnússon, a pioneer of infant swimming, welcomes babies all day long, six days a week.

The pool becomes a world of it's own, where the sensory world of newborns is explored through sound, play and underwater experiences.





SNORRI MAGNÚSSON is a sports teacher and physical therapist who started teaching infant swimming when his twin daughters were born 28 years ago. He had tried to get Icelandic babies in the pool before, after he read an article on baby swimming in a magazine. At the time parents were skeptical. So he had to wait until he had his own children. Once he began, his classes were quickly embraced and he became Iceland's pioneer of infant swimming. With no one in Iceland to look up to he had to create his own program built on his own techniques and ideology as a teacher. Today, Snorri has inspired thousands of young families. His class is built up through routines developed over the years and repeated over and over again until the routines turn into rituals. He uses songs to connect to specific exercises. And he's a performer who enjoys the attention of his audience: The babies. A true visionary, Snorri prefers to stay in the pool where babies dive, stand in his palm, sing and are happy. The pool becoming a world of its own where new parents bond with their newborns in challenging situations.



DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT:

We have all been participants in Snorri's infant swimming class and we were immediately fascinated by the concept and the pioneer Snorri himself. Snorri's belief in his work is unflinching. He is very intuitive with the babies and shares a special bond with them.

His unique charm and personality make him a colorful character and Snorri's pool is exceptionally picturesque, the surroundings are primitive but the rounded pool is perfect for the babies. This documentary is also about the fundamentally important years that no one remembers, from birth until the age of two.

DIVE: rituals in water is about a man with a strong vision and passion for his work. We follow the journey of the babies from their first class to their last and watch their achievements as they go through the rituals of Snorri's class.

ELÍN HANSDÓTTIR is a visual artist based in Berlin and Reykjavik. Her site-specific installations take many forms, including auditory or optical illusions, labyrinthian tunnels and motion-activated architectural elements. 

HANNA BJÖRK VALSDÓTTIR is a documentary producer & director with MA in Media, Culture and Communications from NYU and BA in English literature from The University of Iceland. As producer, Hanna Björk is a two-time recipient of The Icelandic Film Awards for Best documentary, in 2010 for *Dreamland* and in 2014 for *The Laxá Farmers*. *Dreamland* premiered in competition

at IDFA and holds the documentary record for attendance in Icelandic cinemas. In 2015 she started her own production company Akkeri Films, with the aim of producing and co-producing creative documentaries for international release. *DIVE: rituals in water* and *The Last Autumn* by Yrsa Roca Fannberg will be released in 2019, with *Little Africa* by Hanna Björk in production and several other projects in development.



AKKERI FILMS is a newly established production company in Reykjavík founded by Hanna Björk Valsdóttir, documentary producer previously working at Ground Control Productions and two-time Edda: Icelandic Film Award recipient for best documentary (Dreamland, 2009 & The Laxá Farmers 2013). Co-founder is established sound designer Björn Viktorsson. The aim of Akkeri Films is to make high quality creative documentaries for international release. DIVE: rituals in water (2019) by Elín Hansdóttir, Anna Rún Tryggvadóttir and Hanna Björk is Akkeri Film's first feature length production and The Last Autumn (2019) by Yrsa Roca Fannberg premiering in competiton at Karlovy Vary. Also in production is Little White Africa by Hanna Björk and other works.


